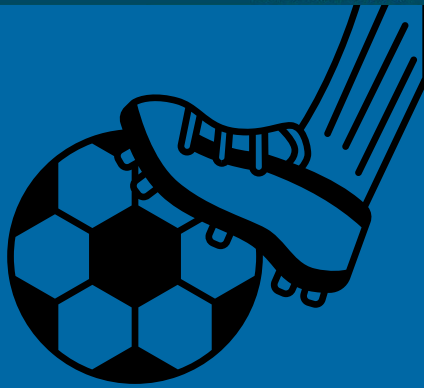
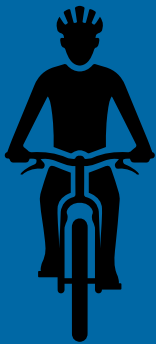

PREVENT 8-UNIT INFILL IN OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

Developers are targeting mature neighbourhoods like ours to build 8-unit rental buildings. In some instances, a single lot has been subdivided and 16 units have been built where a single family home once stood. Such developments can increase traffic, crime and transient populations and may negatively impact property values and neighbourhood appeal. This can erode our community character, property values and quality of life, while driving up crime rates and traffic. While infill isn't inherently bad, it needs reasonable boundaries to protect the character, charm and long-term value of our community.

Update

Following discussion at our recent AGM, it is clear that citywide policies supporting increased infill development are expected to continue. Council did recently vote down (8 to 4 vote) a proposal to reduce mid block infill from 8 to 6 units. While the City establishes overall planning direction, individual communities may wish to explore tools that help guide how development evolves within their own neighbourhoods.

One such option is the use of a Restrictive Covenant, which can help outline shared community expectations and provide an additional layer of clarity for future development. Many communities across Edmonton are currently reviewing similar approaches as part of their long-term planning conversations.

Our recent community survey showed strong support for maintaining single-family housing character, with openness to options such as a basement suite or garden suite.

Next Steps

We will be hosting a community Town Hall to begin discussing potential wording for a WWCC Restrictive Covenant and to share information about the process. This will also be an opportunity for residents to ask questions, provide input, and learn how they can participate in upcoming neighbourhood outreach.

Complete the Courts Application Form (one per adult) and email to the office.

Step 4:

Submit Payment (per adult/child if applicable)

Receive an access link to your phone to enter the courts.

Community League & Courts Memberships renew on September 1. **Membership period: September 1 - August 31** (regardless of purchase date).

MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS

Resident: Resides in Westridge / Wolf Willow / Country Club (WWCC)

Associate: Resides outside the WWCC community

OUTDOOR COURT PLAY INFORMATION

Courts are available whenever a court member wants to play, provided a court is free.

If all courts are occupied, players wait their turn.

First group to complete one game to 11 releases the court to waiting players.

Courts are not reserved unless officially rented through the office.

Rental guide available at the office.

Members may bring their own foursome (all must be court members).

Guest fees apply (see website for details).

Generally, courts are accessible without long waits.

Here's to another fantastic year ahead!

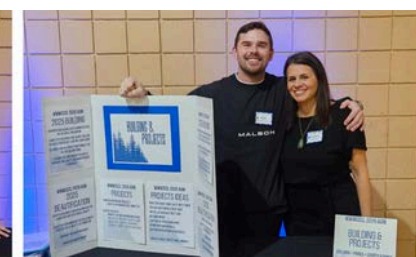
